**This guide has been created for anyone who wants to find a venue in Greets Green in which to hold activities and events of any kind. Local facilities range from a choice of meeting rooms for a handful of people to one of the country's largest auditoriums which seats 2,500.**

Greets Green has a wealth of community venues offering superb facilities that are available to hire by the community and organisations wishing to engage with local people. Many of these have been developed and expanded thanks to Greets Green Partnership.

Since its launch in 2000, the Partnership has helped many organisations to refurbish and improve their venues, enabling them to encourage the wider community to use the excellent facilities on their doorstep. Capital funding has been invested into various venues, while the Partnership team has helped with the management of others.

All the venues and facilities listed in this guide are available for anyone to hire and will only continue to be successful if more and more people use them.

Bringing communities together while recognising the diversity of the area has been a priority for the Partnership. It's important that people have places they can feel comfortable in. The wide-ranging venues and facilities which have been developed in the area give people the opportunity to meet with others from a similar community or to join with people from all different backgrounds.

Greets Green is proud of the diverse communities which make the area such a lively and vibrant place. Along with the wide range of community venues, this guide also details the main communities of Greets Green and how to get in touch with them.

We hope you find this guide useful as well as interesting and are sure you'll discover a venue which is perfect for you in Greets Green!

## Meeting & Learning

Over the years, Greets Green Partnership has been keen to enable everyone to continue learning as long as they want to – whatever their age. This is why it set up a network of Community Access Points (CAPs) and e-learning centres which have gone from strength to strength.

Many of the community venues listed within this guide are either CAPs or e-learning centres – or both – and offer a range of learning opportunities on your doorstep.

## What is an E-learning Centre?

Working with Click! Greets Green, Greets Green Partnership set up 12 e-learning centres across Greets Green, enabling local people – from children to silver surfers - to develop their IT skills.

E-learning centres can be found in community venues such as primary schools, the YMCA and the Guru Nanak Community Centre, and many sit alongside Community Access Points, creating an excellent community resource.

Each centre provides e-learning opportunities for all ages and everyone is welcome to attend the range of IT courses on offer at the centres – whether you're an IT novice or a computer whizz kid.

# What is a CAP?

**Community Access Points (CAPs) provide facilities where clubs, groups and anyone in the community can hold activities, events and meetings.**

Greets Green Partnership funded the creation of 10 CAPs throughout the area at schools and community centres, and set up a team of Community Learning Workers to develop activities at them.

Most CAPs were developed by upgrading existing facilities. However at Lyng Primary and Newtown Primary Schools there was no spare room to use, so brand new self-contained units were literally craned in. Facilities at these two CAPs include a computer suite, multi-sensory room, various function rooms, a kitchen and a relaxing area, and hundreds of local people have enjoyed meeting and socialising there.

The team of Community Learning Workers, which included local residents, got regular courses off the ground at the CAPs and helped those based at schools to offer more activities out of school hours. These have included before and after school clubs, sport, homework clubs and support for parents.

Since the network of CAPs was first established, hundreds of activities have been held in these venues. At Lodge Primary CAP alone, activities have ranged from IT drop-in sessions, English courses and yoga to sewing classes and a parents' workshop.

At Lyng Primary CAP, there's a mother and toddler group, an after school club and a playgroup, along with regular parties and activities.

Youth clubs, IT classes and community meetings are just some of the varied uses of all the CAPs and residents are continually encouraged to come up with new ideas for how they can benefit the community.

# The Greets Green Business Community

## Greets Green Community Enterprises (GGCE)

Greets Green Partnership has made such a difference to the local community that it's important that this work doesn't simply stop when the Partnership comes to an end in 2010. That's why Greets Green Community Enterprises (GGCE) has been set up.

Its aim is to develop local enterprise to create resources for the community. This means starting a whole range of new community enterprises in Greets Green, as well as working to obtain contracts to deliver services in the area so that the community has more control over what's provided locally.

In 2008, GGCE purchased Belper Enterprise Park in Greets Green Road. This placed GGCE as a significant player in the Greets Green business community.

The Enterprise Park provides a base for GGCE's own social enterprises as well as the established companies which have been based there for some time. The organisation's first social enterprise is a computer hardware recycling company which disposes of, and recycles, unwanted electrical and electronic equipment for companies.

GGCE employs and trains local people to run its community enterprises, which reinvest no less than half of the income generated back into the community.

By creating more businesses, GGCE is generating more opportunities for local employment and training. Once other companies know that there's a skilled workforce available locally, it's hoped that they will be encouraged to relocate to Greets Green.

As well as a commercial focus, GGCE also has a community focus. Both aspects work together to provide the best possible work, training and leisure opportunities.

The organisation manages Wood Lane Community Centre which offers a wide range of activities for local people of all ages. Many local groups use the centre as a meeting place including an after-school club and an arts and crafts group.

Plus, the community centre provides a base for organisations who are keen to help the local community. These include a local food bank which distributes food to those in need, a hairdressers, a training organisation and a community carelink service which provides support to help people live independently.

# The Greet's Green Business Community

## Albion Business Improvement District (BID)

In 2006, one of the first industrial Business Improvement Districts (BID) was established in Greet's Green.

A BID is a partnership arrangement through which local organisations and the local business community agree to take forward practical schemes which will benefit the local business community.

Businesses agreed to pay extra rates to fund additional local improvements, such as tackling litter and graffiti, creating extra security with more lighting and CCTV, and improving parking, transport and open spaces.

The Greet's Green BID was a trail-blazer as such initiatives usually involve retail and commercial areas rather than industrial ones.

Greet's Green Partnership was instrumental in launching the BID which covers around 80 local firms. All businesses in the Albion Road area were asked to vote on whether to create a BID and the majority agreed to create a brighter future by working together.

Each business pays an extra 4 per cent on their rates and this had enabled a range of improvements to be funded. A state of the art CCTV monitoring system has been set up around the main roads in the area to improve security and, as a result, there have been major reductions in crime rates in the area.

A range of other additional services and improvements are also helping to help make the Albion Road area a better business location.

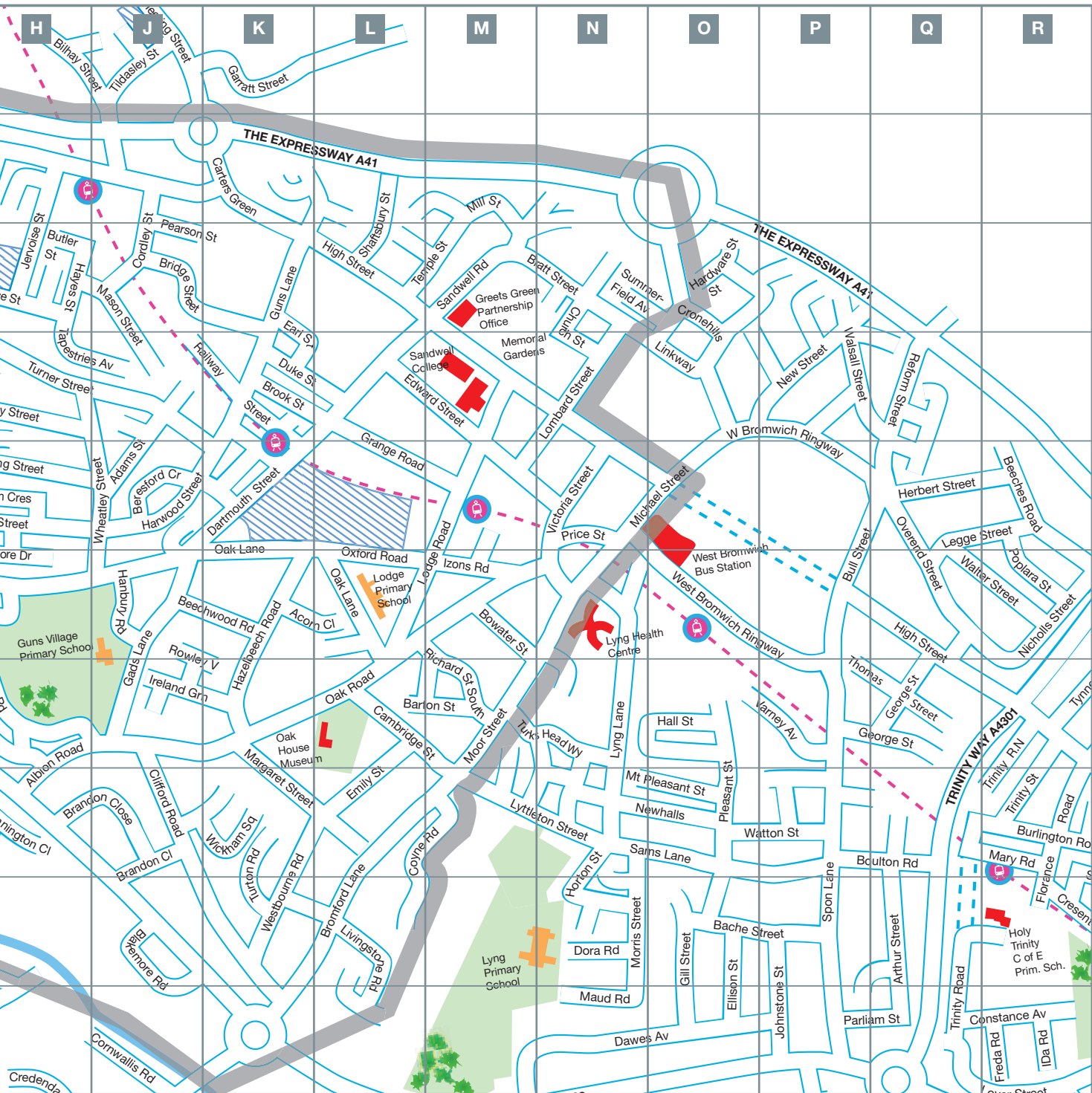
